



WILMAR NOT INVOLVED IN LEGAL ACTION AGAINST ROBIN WOOD PROTESTERS

Wilmar International is aware of the concern over eight protesters from the Robin Wood group who were removed from outside its refinery in Brake, Germany on 17 September 2012. The first of the eight protesters appeared in court on 30 October 2013 to appeal a penalty order.

We would like to make it clear that Wilmar is in no way involved in the current penalty orders served against the Robin Wood protesters. Wilmar has not pursued any legal action whatsoever against the protesters in question, and has no intention of doing so.

During Robin Wood's otherwise peaceful protest, demonstrators blocked a vehicle belonging to a Wilmar contractor from leaving the site for several hours. A special police task force was called in after local police failed to remove demonstrators from the site.

Wilmar respects the right to peaceful protest and recognises the importance of the issues at hand. We are committed to peaceful land claim resolution in line with the standards set out by the Roundtable on Sustainable Palm Oil. Wilmar is always prepared to engage in constructive dialogue with relevant stakeholders and NGOs, and therefore reaffirms its willingness to engage in open dialogue with Robin Wood in order to address their concerns.
